School Supply Fee:

The Department of Education is covering the school supply fee for students in grades K-9 for the 2026 – 2027 school year.

2026 Exploratory Fee for Grades 7 - 9:

When students return in September, students in grades 7-9 will be asked to pay an exploration fee of \$31.50, which will be used to offset the materials used in Industrial Arts & Home Ec.

Band Fee 2026:

When we return in September, we will be collecting a band fee for students in grades 6-9 who are involved in our band program. The fee for Grades 7-9 is 52.50 and Grade 6 fee is 26.50. The proceeds from this fee will be used for equipment purchases and instrument repairs and band shirts for grades 7, 8 & 9.

We are asking when students leave the band program in grade 9, to return their shirts to be used for future band students. As well this fee can be paid through our Cash Net on-line portal in the fall

School Cash Online
